- hear the research and support behind the ‘two foot leaner’ Orca Start and the benefits it has over a track start
- work with Master Champion Zsejke Tusa, along with age group swimmers, as they demonstrate the start
- observe Coach Wunderlin teach the start to swimmers
- teach the swimmers from their club the start
- receive feedback from Coach Wunderlin and Assistant Coach Gerry Palmer while teaching their swimmer the start
- take this information back to their club
- give input and suggestions on the starting block prototype

Our Presenters:



Matt Wunderlin, WOW Head Coach

Matt Wunderlin swam for Knox College from 1994-1998, being the men’s team captain both junior and senior year while earning a degree in biochemistry. He swam 2 years at UCLA in their Master’s Program and 1 year at the University of Illinois at Chicago where he did research in developmental biology. He is also a member of the United States Air National Guard where he won a national award in his career field and has trained Special Forces swimmers. Matt has coached former Master’s World Record holders and Olympic hopefuls. He has also taught swimming to inner city youth.

Matt has been WOW’s full-time head coach since 2006. He is Wisconsin Swimming’s Diversity Chair for the LSC and was the state’s only representative for a recent summit at the Olympic Training Center. Matt has taught numerous stroke and technique clinics and has been a speaker at Wisconsin Swimming’s “Swimposium”. He is a member of ASCA and was recently published in **American Swimming**, a professional swim coach’s publication. His article, entitled “How We Found a Faster Start” has sparked the national swimming community’s interest. It has led to his involvement in the development of a starting block prototype for the 2012 Olympics and a speaking engagement at the 2010 NCAA Division 1 Swim Championships.

Gerry Palmer, Assistant Coach

Gerry has been coaching swimming for over 40 years, the last 3 years with WOW. He coached Waunakee High School Boys swimming for 7 successful seasons (1988-1996). As coach of the Warrior Men, he took the team to second in the Badger conference with only 1 loss the entire season. This stands as the best conference season in Warrior history. Gerry's final year as Warrior Coach was capped with the first ever state qualifiers from Waunakee. He coached Craig Laufenberg in High School and at the 1996 Paralympics in Atlanta, where he earned a bronze medal for the USA in the 50 meter backstroke. Gerry is a high school swimming official and has worked with Coach Wunderlin on perfecting and testing the start.



Zsejke Tusa, World Masters Champion

Zsejke took second place in the 100 butterfly, 50 butterfly, 50 backstroke and 100 backstroke at the 2009 Long Course National Championships. She has been an All-American Masters swimmer since 2004 and was the 2004 FINA World Masters Champion in the 100 butterfly at Riccione, Italy. In that same year she was part of the record setting 200 meter freestyle relay. She holds 10 Illinois state records and has won the Illinois Masters State meet high point award 6 of the last 7 years. In May of 2004, she was recognized as the Cliff Bar Athlete of the Month. As team captain, Zsejke helped lead the Drury women's swim team to the NCAA Division II Championship for 4 years and was named All-American in the 1998-1999 season.
